He will speak on "The Revival of 600 meters" in his present capacity of Experimental Project Manager for The 500 KC Experimental Group for Amateur Radio.

He was appointed the project coordinator for the ARRL-sponsored 500-kHz experiment and responsible for obtaining the WD2XSH experimental license which initially allows a group of 21 amateurs to begin exploration of this unique part of the spectrum, possibly paving the way for a future amateur band. The two key objectives of the license are:

Demonstration of Non interference with other services; as well as Experimentation with regional ground-wave communications.

Hi Wendell, Got the invoice and, as they say, "The check's in the mail!!;-)

Here is some info on the Keystone Radio School at the Bedford Springs that we talked about on the phone.

Information is really lacking here in Bedford (of all places!); mostly just newspaper articles.

I would like to know if any of our members, besides you, attended the school and have any memories or artifacts they would like to share.

As I mentioned on the phone, my father, too old for the service, was the manager of buildings and grounds at the school. He was well-suited for the job: he was the golf pro!;-) Mostly he was a boyhood chum of the school's founder.

Wendell,

The diploma arrived here safely; no tears, bends or dirt! How ever does our postal service do it?:-D

The document is quite impressive. I see it was signed by Stanley Stroup, the founder and president of the schools. He was my fathers very good friend (gave him the job at the school) and got me into the Coast Guard when they had a waiting list of over two years in the late 50s-early 60s. He was a Lt. Cmdr in the Naval Reserve but on the phone, of course, he was a typical "telephone Commander," just like a "telephone Colonel," or like we had at the university, "telephone professors." If you taught there, whether an instructor or full professor, on the phone one was "Professor," just like Lt. Cols., etc.:-D

Thank you very much for sending this historic document; I doubt if there's another one in the entire county. I will protect it and cherish it.

Would you be so kind as to let us know some facts about your personal and professional history that we may include w/ the document? Doesn't need to be long or extremely detailed - just some things about " your early life, how you came to be in the Navy, at this school, any impressions about the school, the area, etc. while you were here; what happened next re the Navy, your professional life after the war and any personal details re family, etc. you'd like to include, all the way up to retirement.

This will bring the document to life and make it much more meaningful and interesting to our

public, don't you think? Any other photos or anything you'd like to contribute that would enhance the story would be appreciated.

I hope you don't think I'm imposing too awfully much, but I think it would make a great story for our Heritage Center (you're too young to be a "museum piece"!!;-))

Holy cow!!

Well, can the hams have those freqs???;-)

I was a coastie op when AMVERS got started: Atlantic Merchant Vessel Reporting System. It's come a long way. We took AMVERS and WX OBS from the merchant ships and relayed it to CG stations (NMH, NMY, NMC, usually, depending on where we were) via cw or to the coastal stations, WCC, WSF, WSL, WMH, WNY, etc. When NMC (what they called by then, CAMSLANT) "went out of the CW business, the CG tracked me down and asked that I deliver the Keynote Address. Then, after a final cw bcst, they collected up the keys from each op position, put them in a box and the Chief, accompanied by an honor guard, carried them away....wasn't a dry eye in the house....

I have a certificate for copying the last transmission (from the dias), and a key (permanently locked down) and medallion mounted on a piece of oak hanging on the wall in my shack. Also got a limited edition ZUT card and number (ZUT - coastie radio oprs group - ZUT = CW Forever!).....

So, Wendell, another era has come to a close, eh?






